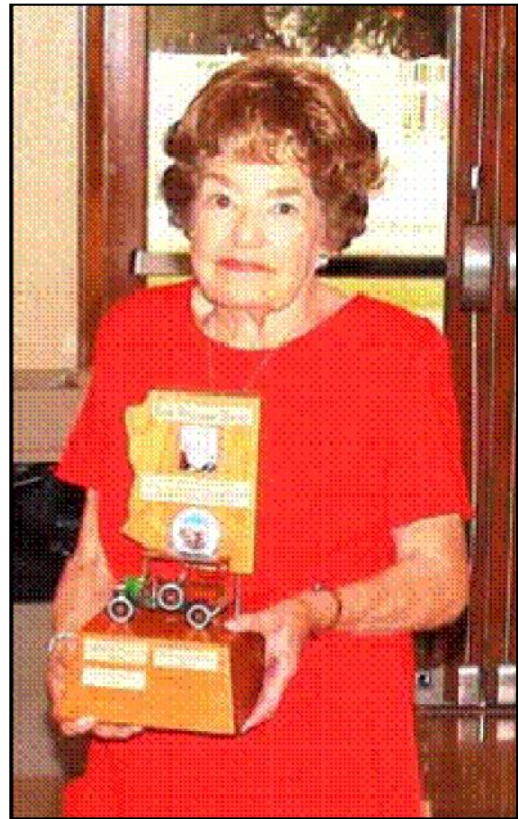

Keep on Drivin'!

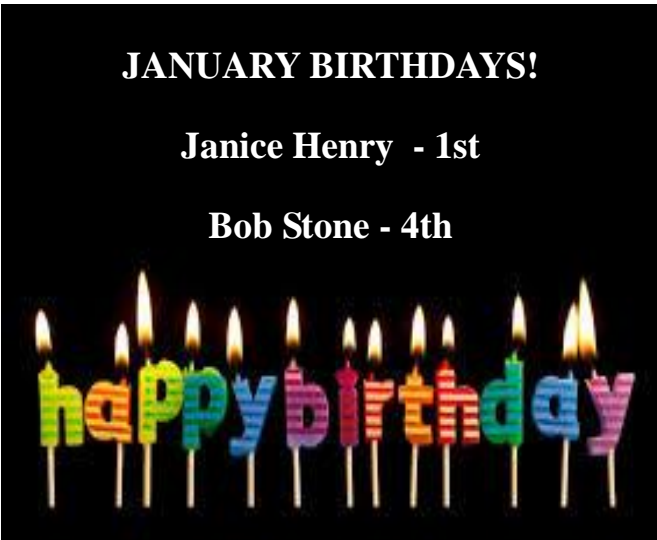
