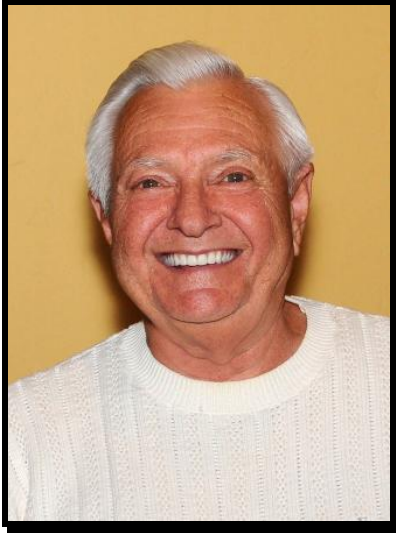

IN THE NEWS!**CONGRATULATIONS TO THE DAVIES
For Winning Two Awards**

Joe and Colleen Davies recently participated in back-to-back tours with their lovely 1911 Model T Ford Torpedo. The first event, sponsored by the Horseless Carriage Club of America Skagit-Snohomish Chapter was the Panhandle Scramble in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. With challenging drives along the edge of Lake Coeur d'Alene, all the way around Hayden Lake and to the tip of Lake Pend Oreille the total mileage was about 350 miles.

The final banquet included awards for Men's Choice, Lady's choice and The President's Choice. This last award usually goes to one of the rare or unusual automobiles of the Brass Era. And there were many fine old cars on this tour. But President Keene Brewer of Yakima had a different idea. He noted that there were 23 Model T Fords participating and that there must be something special about them based on their popularity. So he selected the most unusual and beautiful from among the group and expressed that he would love to have one. As he announced that Joe and Colleen's white 1911 Torpedo Speedster as the winner, there were quite a few surprised expressions in the room. A Model T Ford had NEVER won this award before so it was a great honor for the Davies and a fitting tribute to the design of Henry Ford.

Immediately following this event Joe and Colleen attended the CanAm which is a fun annual event sponsored by individual Model T Ford owners. The host location alternates each year between Canada and the USA. This year Mike Stormo chaired the tour based in Spokane. During three full days of driving and eating we saw a few roadside problems including Joe's car gradually losing power. Fortunately the very knowledgeable Mike Robison quickly diagnosed the problem, tore the carburetor apart, cleaned it thoroughly and had Joe on the road in little time.

At the final banquet, there was an award for the oldest car on the tour. Although there was another 1911 car on the tour, it had already won a different award, so Joe and Colleen were recognized again.

Of course we congratulate them on their winning these honors, but more so we appreciate their spirit. How brave it is for a couple to buy a car they don't know how to drive, sign up for multiple tours and learn how to take care of the inevitable problems. All in one year! The best lesson they learned however was that other Model T owners are always willing to help out and share their knowledge. That is what our hobby is all about and Joe and Colleen very much appreciate finding new friends to help them along the way.

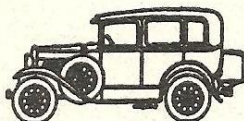
