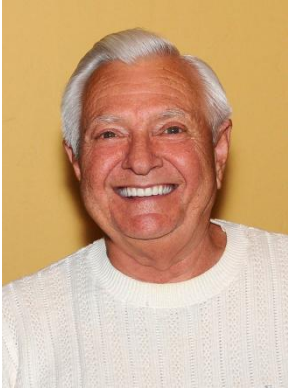

green Depression glass and Lorna's beautiful pink Depression glass. Additional decorations were vintage ladies hats, tea cups and flowers.



Sandy welcomed everyone and thanked the ladies that contributed food for the special event. Lorna then shared some notes about teas 'Life is like a cup of tea to be filled to the brim and enjoyed with friends, If teacups could talk they would have much to say about the past, present and the future'. She then gave the blessing. 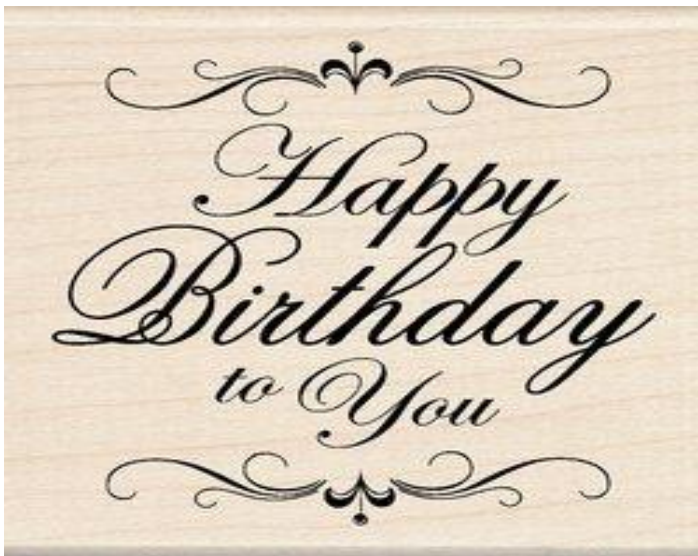


## *Dead Horse Ranch weekend.....*

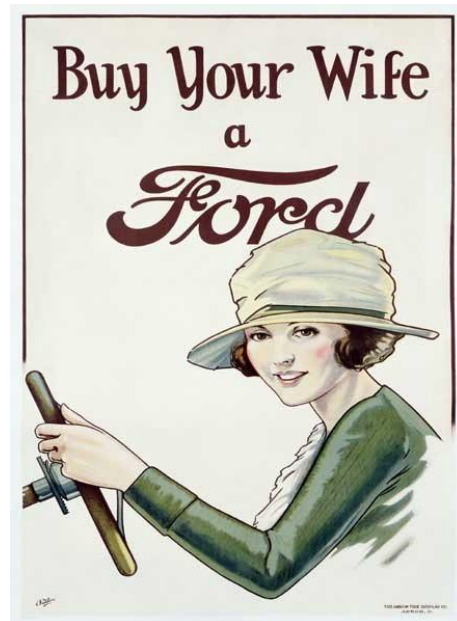

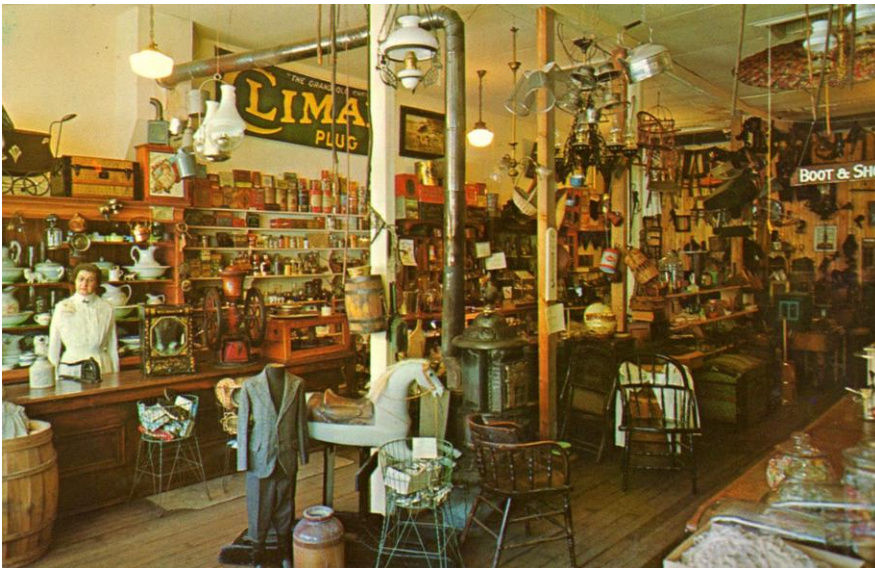

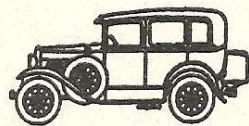
