



1914 Touring, older restoration, Paint is excellent however there may be a ding or two as we have driven it several tours if they were guaranteed not to have any gravel roads! 1927 engine and transmission, Performance T High Compression Head, 290 touring cam, adjustable lifters, larger valves with harden eats, Texas T Distributor with Petronics Electronic Ignition, High Volume intake manifold, 12 volt alternator, battery, 12 modern coil (no Model T coils), stock exhaust, brand new Brass Works flat tube radiator, Jack Rabbit clutch, Kevlar bands, small 1914 pedals, hand & foot accelerator, KC Warford Under/Overdrive transmission, Rebuilt

3.63 large drum rear end, Texas T Sure Stop Disc Brakes, 12 volt starter, New hickory wooden spokes and felloes wheels, New Universal 30X3.5 tires and tubes, Turn signals and brake lights, Halogen Bulb inserts in headlamps, Kerosene side and tail lanterns, All the brass is excellent, Carbide generator is disconnected, New top, Calf Leather diamond tucked seats, Maple Firewall, Original Speedometer, Wooden Steering Wheel, 5:1 ratio steering, rebuilt front end, four dipper pan.

This professionally rebuilt Model T started as a very solid 1914 Touring. I have the original rear end housing, double wishbone and aluminum non-starter hogs head. This car was built with performance, reliability and the beauty of an original Model T in mind. It will proudly stand up against any other Model T in a car show, except the disc brakes are hard to hide. It will not be left behind on a tour because of a hill or flat straight away. The best thing is it will STOP! If you are going to sit and look at a Model T in a museum, leave them stock. But it you plan to drive it at all, but brakes on them. Rocky Mountain Brakes are dangerous they will let you down right when you need them.

I had not installed the brakes in the photos. The Model T is located in Camdenton, Missouri. Asking \$23,900. Jeff Henry, Larry Hart and Bill Allen have seen it. Bill has ridden in it.


