

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE





The meeting was called to order Ken Henry about 7:05 p.m. on May 19, 2016, at the Citadel. He led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Since Secretary Bert Diehl was absent, Jan Peterson was asked to substitute for him. Jan had passed out dash plaques prior to the meeting and had given Austin Graton a get-well card at that time. She read the minutes of the April meeting which were approved as read.

Treasurer Dave Veres reported that the current balance is \$3955.97. There is an outstanding bill of \$625.00 due for the Dead Horse Ranch tour next year; seven cabins are reserved. The June fee of \$48 for our website is due soon. The treasurer's report was approved.

Tom Hoverson, Vice President, announced that we have no new members. Name tags are available for \$1.00 each.

The summer get togethers were summarized: on June 18 we may have breakfast at Biscuits on Gilbert Road south of the freeway, but this location is not yet confirmed by Claudia Linney; we will meeting for breakfast in July at T.C. Eggington's with Elms' being in charge; and August activity will be at the Organ Stop Pizza with Tom Hoverson in charge.

It was announced that Linneys are now grandparents.

Steve Nissle, the newspaper editor, announced that he needs all articles, pictures, etc., for the next newsletter on May 26. Ken will write an article for the Schnepf Farms tour. The summer events will appear in the September newsletter. He told us that even though there has been a change in personnel at the Citadel, we may still meet here.

Ken reported on the Schnepf Farms tour, especially how busy it was there on that Saturday—20,000 people, causing the trip there to take much longer than expected. Members commented on the food and other attractions there.

Austin won the 50/50 raffle and walked away with \$11.00.


