

The story behind our '27 T Touring, by Keith Gumbinger

Carol and I have been wintering in Apache Junction for about 12 years. During that time we've joined the Canyon Country Model T Club and the East Valley Model T Club. For that entire time, we didn't have any of our T's here in AZ, so on club events we'd ride with someone in their T or follow along in our modern car.

In 2019 we bought a place in Roadhaven RV Resort in Apache Junction. I've always wanted a T to use while we're here in the winter & now that we have our own place, I went looking for one. I decided I wanted a '26 or '27 Touring. I wanted a Touring here so we would be able to bring others with us, and I have a '26 Roadster Pickup and a '27 Fordor at home, and I like those years. I also wanted a restored car as I don't have room to restore one here and don't have the tools, etc. here to do it. Tinkering on one though is ok, and even desired.

It didn't take long to find one. A fellow MTFCA member in the Florida Panhandle had one that seemed just right, and the price was quite reasonable. He sent lots of pictures. It is a recently restored car with a very nice paint job. I wanted this car to be a driver, so some modern performance equipment was desirable also, and this car has it. The engine was freshly rebuilt by Gator Gould and Dan Hatch, 2 respected Model T'ers, and it has new babbitt, a Scat Crankshaft, a Z head and was balanced. The paint and body work had already been done by a previous owner. They had welded in lots of body panels and rebuilt the entire chassis. The guys that did the chassis were not T guys. I could tell that easily since they didn't install cotter pins in several places and they also used lots of phillips head screws, and we all know that T's didn't have phillips head screws as they were not available until 1936. The car has also been converted to 12 volts, has turn signals and a bright flasher on the back for night time driving, safety hubs in the rear end, new tires and a new radiator. I figured this car should be a good T driver and it has proved to be just that.

I decided not to go see the car before buying it as it would cost about \$1,500.00 to do that and the seller is known to other Model T'ers as a good person. In fact, one of those other Model T'ers said that if we didn't buy it, they would! I figured that if some things were not to my satisfaction, I could use the \$1,500.00 I saved by not going to see the car before buying it to cover any things that needed correcting.

We had the car shipped here and as we were then gone for the Christmas season, a fellow model T'er in the area took delivery of it and stored it until we returned. We owe that person a big debt of gratitude for his help on that.

We've had the car for almost 2 years already and have been driving it a lot. The coils were supposedly rebuilt by a very well known coil rebuilder, but the car didn't seem to run just right. We adjusted the coils on an ECCT, and that helped a lot, but one coil still had a defect. I have since replaced that coil and will be installing an I Timer soon.

The upholstery is new and nice, but not installed correctly. It's ok for now, but we may have it corrected in the future.

I'm a Gold Card Judge in the MTFCI thanks to encouragement from Russ Furstnow. As you can imagine, being a judge, I've thoroughly evaluated the car for authenticity, and found several things that are not correct for a '27. I won't belabor what I found, but maybe someday when there's time, I'll show them to you. It's ok though, as this car is a driver, and it serves that purpose quite well.

We plan to keep this car here in AZ, and may never take it to our home in Wisconsin as we have 4 T's there already. This T is our AZ driver, and we've very happy that we finally have one here to enjoy with all the nice model T'ers here in the Canyon Country and East Valley T clubs.
