### Model T Clinic at Ken Lester's House, April 23

Another successful Model T clinic was held April 23 at Ken Lester's house in Glendale. We had all arrived by 10 AM. Larry Hart, Bill Allen, Ray Moore, Rich Huggins, David Ker, Aaron Ker, Tom Hoverson, Ernia Amado and I think I am still missing 1 person. We were tasked to install a Planetor gear box on a 1914 center door. It has a deep burgundy metallic fleck body with black fenders in very nice condition. Ken had a large 3 bay garage with a second story for storage. There was a car lift but it was thought safer to do the work on the ground. He had enough tools to get the job done except for a wheel puller that Larry Hart provided. The garage doors were just 2 inches too short, so we started by having 4 people stand on the running boards to get the T into the garage. We started by removing the rear tires, spare tire, rear light then to the rear end complete with leaf springs and torque tube. Once out we were challenged with removing the driveshaft spool and torque tube. Some of us lived under the T for most of the operation. Once the drive shaft was separated, we noted that the pinion gear was 11 teeth and damaged even though it looked new and we used the old 10 tooth pinion gear. We had issues with some hard parts to disassemble and it seemed that after trying 2 or 3 ways to do it one of us had come up with a relatively easy solution to separate the parts. It sure does help having many heads working on this project because it seemed that each one of us had one or two insights that made all the work possible. Ken went to the local hardware store to get a few nuts and bolts. After reassembling and installing the rear end with its new gear box we worked on installing the shifter and linkage. They went in nicely except the linkage had to be cut down to fit the shorter distance of the Planetor transmission compared to the Ruckstel axel that it had been adapted from. By now it was 4 PM and we were down to 5 of us working on the car. All the doughnuts and most of the drinks that had been supplied that morning was gone. Ken offered some dinner, but we were more interested in getting the job done. We stood on the running boards and pushed her out of the garage, started the car and it would not move. After working on the Planetor shifter we got it into gear. The engine and the gear box were working smoothly.

Update: Ken and Ernia continued working this last week to correctly adjust the linkage on the Planator gear box, so it works in both high and low gear as well as changing out the hub bolts on the front wheels that were not the correct size and not tightened at all, making for a very unsafe and wabbly front end.

Another clinic completed and more knowledge gained by all those who participated.

Ken Lester gave many thanks to all those who helped upgrade his Ford Model T.


Our first year had a number of rather ambitious tours, and within a few years we were doing overnighters to Tucson and Southern Arizona. We hosted the National business meeting in 2010.


Following the tour we have planned a picnic at Papago Park next to the zoo. Each family will bring a lunch their own lunch (but if you want to share that's okay too).




#### Goldfield Ghost Town Tour By Jan Peterson


