# EAST VALLEY MODEL T FORD CLUB OVERNIGHT "CIRCLE UP" April 23 and 24, 2005

April 23 and 24, 2005 are the dates for the East Valley Model T Ford Club's overnight event at Usury Mountain Park in Mesa. The park is located off of Ellsworth Road in NE Mesa. It is

approximately 7 miles north of US 60 (Superstition Freeway).

The "Circle Up" will take place in a group camping area at the park. The area has a large covered Ramada with six picnic tables, fire ring, lighting, hose bib and electrical outlets. There is also a restroom facility equipped with showers nearby. There are no hook-ups for campers, but plenty of room for camper parking as well as tent sites. For those who want hook-ups, they are available within a few hundred feet for a nightly fee of \$18.00. For these sites they are available on 'first-come-first-served' basis.

We would like as many people to participate as possible in order to make this a fun event. We are hoping most participants will bring their Model T's and spend the night as well. However, if you cannot or don't want to bring your Model T, come out anyway with another old car, your modern car or even by horse — just come on out!!! There is a \$5.00 park entry fee per car. I don't know if they charge for a horse.

The park opens at 8:00 A.M. but we have a check it time of not earlier than 10:00 am

(normally 12 noon) so those arriving before noon should bring a picnic lunch. In the afternoon, at about 3:00 P.M., we will depart for a short tour of about 12 miles or so. We will then return to the park for a potluck dinner. We can cook on site with either your own stove, the electrical hook-ups or on the campfire. The Graton's will bring some wood, but if you have some, bring it also.

After the evening meal there will be entertainers who tell jokes and sing country music around the campfire. For those staying overnight we will do a group breakfast in the morning. Please bring your favorite breakfast item to be cooked. Check out time is at 12:00 Noon.

I have asked the Usery Park to publicize our event in their newsletter to help bring more attention to our club and the Model T.

Monthly Recipe Corn Pudding

1/4 cup sugar

3 tablespoons all-purpose flour

2 teaspoons baking powder

2 teaspoons salt

6 large eggs

2 cups whipping cream

½ cup butter or margarine, melted

6 cups fresh corn kernels \*

Combine first four ingredients.

Beat eggs with a fork in a large bowl; stir in whipping cream and butter. Gradually add sugar mixture, stirring until smooth; stir in corn. Pour mixture into a lightly greased 13x9x2 in baking dish.

Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until deep golden and mixture is set. Let stand 5 minutes. Yield: 8 servings.

\* Substitute 6 cups frozen whole kernel corn









## Model T Coupe Snowmobile owned by Bob Weis of Dublin, NH Before and After restoration photos
