## A Model 'T' Ford Experience Or How we earned the "Trail Travail Trophy" By Austin Graton

In late January I rebuilt my starter with the help of Bob Hayne, a member of the Sun Country Model T Ford Club. It had continued to turn ever more slowly starting about a year ago. So, I finally took to time to fix it. I have been cranking the car for nearly a year. The problems encountered in rebuilding the starter will be the subject of another article.

Once the starter was installed it did nothing. I then replaced the battery to starter switch cable...still nothing. Next. I decided to check out the starter switch. When I took it apart I concluded that it might have been the The copper tri-leaf only problem. contacts were so corroded and worn there was no way it could have made There was about  $\frac{1}{2}$ contact. teaspoon of corrosion bouncing around inside the switch. One of the contacts at the bottom of the switch had worn so badly the tri-leaf contacts nearly shorted out on the switch case. To fix that problem I took the contact out and added another fiber washer between it and the case to raise it up. After reinstalling the switch I tried the

starter again and it worked great. The car started but as soon as I let off the starter switch it died. I had hooked the ignition wire to the starter side of the switch instead of the battery side. Once connected properly it started and ran fine. At about 8:30 PM on February 6<sup>th</sup> I was finally ready for the February Tour to commence from the Rosers home. Made it to the cookout with no problem. Then off to the Antique Malls.

The trip from the Rosers to the point where the car died was only 5 or 6 miles. In my haste to get the car going I had not tightened the new battery cable terminal. The nut came off the bolt at the terminal allowing the bolt to back out and short against the battery carrier, killing the engine.
