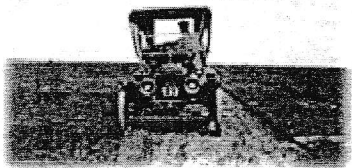

Pumpkin Pie

1 ½ cup Sugar	1 tsp Salt
3 ½ tea Pumpkin Spice	4 large eggs
1(29 oz) can Pumpkin	
2 (12 oz) cans evaporated milk	
2 unbaked 9 inch pie shells	

Mix all together well into pie shells and bake in preheated 425 degree oven for 15 min, then turn down oven to 350 degrees for 40 to 50 min, put foil around the sides to pie shells so it will not get too brown. Test pies doneness by inserting knife in center of pie if comes out clean pie is done. Serve hot or cold

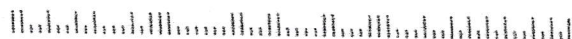
During the summer months, members generally meet for breakfast at a local restaurant on the 3rd Saturday of each month for informal gatherings.
