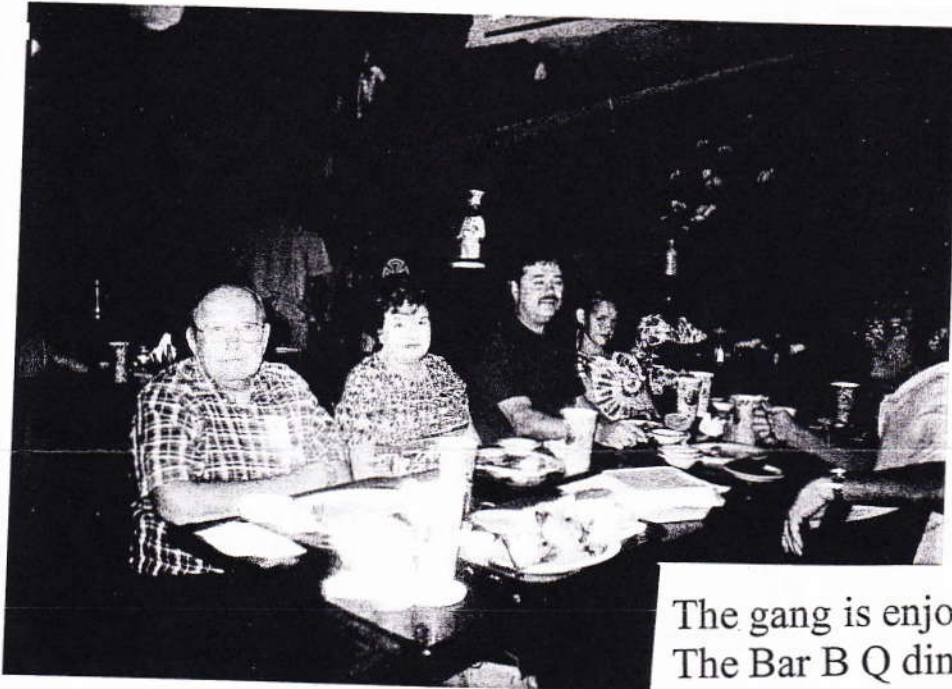

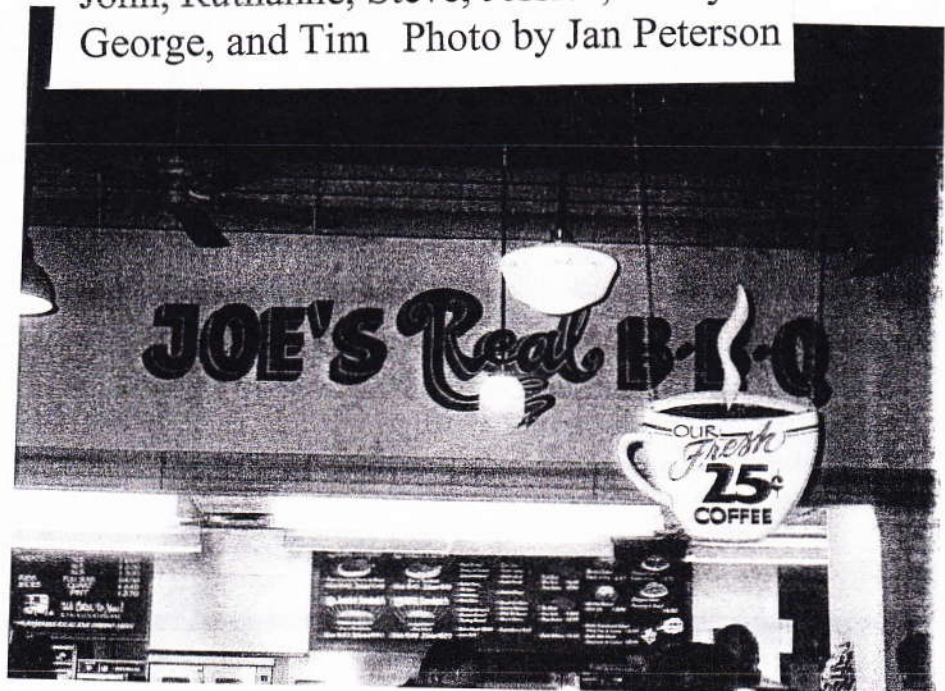
## Health and Welfare:

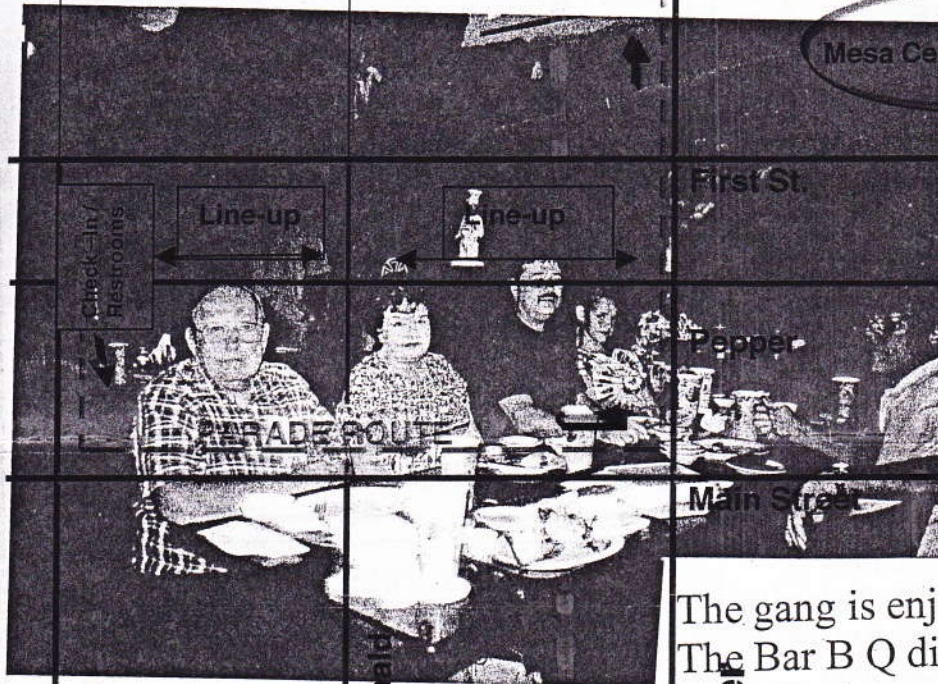

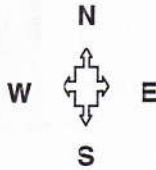

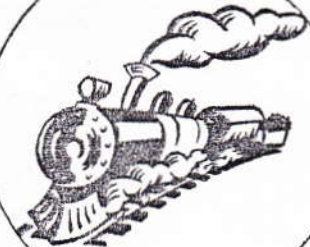

## Rum Cake

1 box (18.25 oz) yellow cake mix  
1 box (3.4 oz) vanilla Jell-O instant pudding mix  
1/2-cup vegetable oil  
1/2-cup water  
1/2-cup dark rum  
4 eggs

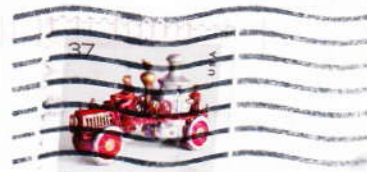
In large mixing bowl combine all ingredients and mix on high speed for 2-3 min. Pour into greased & floured Bunt cake pan & bake @ 350 degrees for 45 minutes. Turn out onto a 9inch pie plate (with a lip) immediately upon removal from oven, when cake is nearly cool poke holes all over (inside, outside, sides and top) using fork, pour glaze over cake.

### GLAZE:

1/4-cup water  
1/2-cup butter  
1-cup sugar  
1/2-cup dark rum

In small saucepan, heat water & butter over med heat. When butter melts, add sugar and stir. Boil for 5 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from heat & stir in dark rum. (You may want to check ID for this cake)
