David and Jean Chance Dinner and Tour

We are all glad we took a CHANCE on this 2 day tour! On Thursday night March 28, 2024 Dave CHANCE and his wife Jean opened up their home to Model T enthusiasts who enjoyed a delicious BBQ catered by Rudy's BBQ and at the same time we all relished the CHANCE to chat with the visiting Flagstaff Model T club members.

The next day, on Friday March 29th, six antique cars, one modern car and 18 people embarked on a CHANCE 48 mile roundtrip adventure from Gilbert, Arizona to the Salt River USS Arizona Memorial, the Odysea Aquarium and the Butterfly Wonderland in Scottsdale, Arizona. Dave CHANCE's turn-by-turn written instructions led us through side streets and the Salt River Pima Reservation to our first stop at the USS Arizona Memorial Gardens dedicated to those lost and those survivors of the ship during the attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. An impressive remembrance collaboration between the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community and the U.S. Navy, the original artifact from the USS Arizona was procured in 2018. An informative and impressive display well worth taking the time to visit. The next stop was the Odysea Aquarium and Butterfly Wonderland, both of which afford the CHANCE to see many undersea and airborne creatures we don't often get to see here in the Southwest Desert. All in all the CHANCEs are very good that you will have a wonderful time on a CHANCE Tour.


3) I have three Model T wire wheels with one front hub and one rear hub. They haven't been primed or painted so there will be no surprises later on. \$350 for everything.
